Psychiatrist: Department of Behavioral Health RESPECT-Mil Program Manager (05 to 06 billet)

Job Description:

As the RESPECT-Mil Program Manager this psychiatrist will be the senior team leader for the RESPECT-Mil initiative which is a behavioral health in primary care initiative. The psychiatrist will serve as the senior rater for the RESPECT-Mil Care facilitators and the behavioral health consultant. Additionally, this individual will interact with the Primary Care site champions in educational initiatives for primary care providers at the installation on behavioral health issues. This provider will also spend half of their time working with the Army Substance Abuse Program as the clinical consultant helping provide clinical management guidance to the 15 providers who operate the Level 1 outpatient treatment facility including direct medication mgmt and difficult case consultation and case review management.

Requirements:

License: A current, unrestricted, and valid medical license from a U.S. State, District of Columbia, Commonwealth, Territory, or other jurisdiction is required.

Training: A candidate must possess a qualifying Doctor of Medicine (M.D.) or Doctor of Osteopathic Medicine (D.O.) degree from a medical school that is accredited by the Council on Medical Education of the American Medical Association or Bureau of Professional Education, Committee on Colleges of the American Osteopathic Association, respectively. However, candidates who are graduates of medical schools that are not located in a U.S. State, District of Columbia, Commonwealth, Territory or other jurisdiction, or a Province or Territory of Canada, may be appointed if they are certified by the Educational Commission for Foreign Medical Graduates and meet all other requirements for appointment.

Minimum 3 year commitment.
